# Immanuel Lutheran Church March 2025 Newsletter

As our calendars turn from February to March this year, we prepare to enter the Time of Easter. (The movable date of Easter is especially late this year, affecting the first day of the Lenten season, Ash Wednesday, as well.)

Easter was the major celebration of the early church, which also set aside a period of preparation to celebrate the Feast of the Resurrection of Our Lord (Easter). Lent was a period of preparation first prescribed for baptismal candidates. During this period, the candidates were examined in preparation for Baptism at the Easter (or Paschal) Vigil. Later, these forty days (excluding Sundays) were associated with Jesus' forty days in the desert before He was tempted and with the forty years the Israelites spent in the wilderness. This made Lent a time of preparation for every Christian from that time onward.

Living as we do under the freedom of the Gospel Lutherans are not required to fast or give up anything during this season. Our congregations often observe Lent by gathering for midweek services, to prepare for the serious events of Holy Week and the joyful celebration of Easter. Here at Immanuel, we maintain this tradition as a beneficial opportunity for all.

This year, on the five Wednesdays after Ash Wednesday, we will gather to meditate on the Five Scenes from the Passion of Our Lord, as follows:

March 12 The Lord's Supper

March 19 Gethsemane

March 26 The Palace of the High Priest

April 2 The Praetorium

April 9 Calvary

These scenes are drawn from the Four Gospels, consolidating their four separate narratives of these events into a single narrative. Although a Passion Play may include events from Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday to his resurrection from the dead or even his ascension into heaven, strictly speaking our Lord's Passion includes only his suffering and death, as described in Matthew 26-27, Mark 14-15, Luke 22-23, and John 18-19. Each Gospel concludes with his resurrection and post-resurrection appearances, as found in Matthew 28, Mark 16, Luke 24 (with Acts 1), and John 20-21.

## God's Instruments, God's Stewards

For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them. (Eph. 2:10)

Some pastors refer to these words as "the most forgotten words in the Scriptures." They are forgotten because they follow the familiar and critical words before it. The preceding two verses that overshadow Ephesians 2:10 are words of justification: "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Eph. 2:8–9). These are words preached regularly. They are assigned as confirmation verses. They carry with them the very heart of what it means to be a redeemed child of God!

Precisely because the previous verses are so central to salvation, they often overpower our practice of stewardship! We have been saved by grace. This is certain and sure because of Jesus. Works play no role in our salvation. No credit taking for us! Grace is freely given. Faith is miraculously created by the Spirit and joyously received. This truth is so wonderful and so encompassing that we often miss out on WHY we are redeemed.

The grace of God revealed in Jesus calls us to faith. But St. Paul doesn't stop with grace and faith. He continues to the logical conclusion. Just like the creation declares the handiwork of God, the redemption of sinners like you and me declares His greatest handiwork! Redeemed stewards are created to reflect the grace and mercy God showers on us to others.

As Lutherans, we understand that good works flow from faith in Jesus Christ. They are the fruit of the tree of salvation into which we have been grafted by grace. Sanctification and stewardship are both on-going and active confessions of what the Lord has done in us. These works are not always spectacular. Many times, they are simply parents showing Jesus to their children. They are compassionate actions that live out the truth of the Gospel to co-workers and even complete strangers. While they can be grand endeavors, more likely they are simple, beautiful works which highlight what Jesus has done in us.

These works aren't random either. They have been planned by God. God planned to use you as a faithful steward as you walk the road that leads you through your daily life. There are no chance encounters or coincidences. They have been planned by the Lord of the universe for the benefit of His creation. Good works are what point to God's greatest work: Jesus!

He calls you and me to walk in this faith, which flows from this grace, which has been poured out on us in Jesus. But even this is not to our credit. We are simply called to be faithful stewards of God's grace so that we may share it with those who need is as much as we do. God's Spirit carries us along in this. We are just the steward — the instrument in His hand to accomplish His plan and glorify Him!

# LOVE AND THE LAW: A TIME FOR PRAYER AND STUDY

Join Southern Illinois Circuit 6 for a workshop on immigration and Christian living on March 15 at Trinity Lutheran Church in Millstadt. Rev Stephen Heimer, manager of All Nations Ministry of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, will present about how we, as Lutheran Christians, live in the reality of loving our neighbors like Jesus has called us to do and encouraging all people to live under God's Law and human laws. Immigration policy and loving our neighbors sometimes creates confusing situations for Christians, and Rev Heimer will help us consider these important and timely topics. The workshop will begin with a prayer service at 9am, and will conclude at noon. An offering will be taken for the St Louis ministry Christian Friends of New Americans.

Speaker Rev Stephen Heimer is currently serving as the LCMS manager of All Nations Ministry. Before that, he served as a parish pastor for 13 years on the border in Texas, serving a combination of Americans and immigrants. He cared for immigrants, armed forces members, customs and border agents, and all other backgrounds. He also cared for people on both sides of the border and provided chapel services at detention centers along the border.


